Dear Chairman Smith and Ranking Member Neal:

As the organizations representing our nation's over 300,000 pharmacists at all sites of care and our millions of patients in every congressional district and state, <u>we are writing to thank you</u> for your continued support and to request a full committee markup of H.R. 1770/S. 2477, the Equitable Community Access to Pharmacist Services Act (ECAPS) this year, and inclusion in any potential end-of-year legislative package.

As you know, ECAPS has strong bipartisan support with 145 cosponsors, including 18 of the 25 members of the majority and 8 of the minority members of the Ways and Means Committee. ECAPS is also supported by more than <u>200 groups</u> representing patients, seniors, and rural Americans, <u>every state pharmacist and pharmacy organization</u>, and <u>113 pharmacy Deans</u> from all over the country—many in committee members' congressional districts.

ECAPS is necessary to maintain access to lower-cost pharmacist-provided test, treatment, and immunization services for common respiratory conditions to one of our nation's most vulnerable populations, our seniors, particularly in rural and medically underserved areas who have come to depend on pharmacists to access critical care and services where no other options often exist.

ECAPS also supports small businesses and helps local community pharmacies keep their doors open to many rural and underserved communities who desperately need access to these health care services. Nine in 10 Americans live within 5 miles of a pharmacy, and patients visit their community pharmacist approximately twice as frequently as any other part of the health care system. Studies have shown that federal and state governments rely on pharmacists as a vital front line of our nation's public health infrastructure, which has <u>saved</u> millions of lives and billions of taxpayer dollars.

Pharmacists provide these services <u>under state laws</u> and receive reimbursement under many Medicaid programs and private insurers, but not Medicare. This is a glaring hole in our nation's primary care system. ECAPS would also ensure Medicare will cover immunizations provided by pharmacists under law, rather than relying on regulatory workarounds that are not codified under federal law.

Action is necessary to protect seniors' access to pharmacist-provided primary care services and keep our nation's pharmacies open. As you know losing a pharmacy is a traumatic experience for a community. <u>Once lost</u>, those communities never get that local pharmacy back. We urge you to act to markup ECAPS and support its inclusion in any end-of-year legislative package. The health and well-being of one of our nation's most vulnerable populations depends on it.
