Continuing Pharmacy Education Programs

The goal of this activity is to improve knowledge regarding the benefits of TasP for patients with HIV and the best practices for implementing TasP in clinical practice.

HIV PrEP: Prescribing PrEP

The purpose of this course is to provide the learner with the knowledge and skills to initiate clinical pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) care and provide follow-up monitoring. This course provides an overview of the pharmacology of the medication used for PrEP, important lab tests, and clinical considerations in starting PrEP. This course reviews ruling out HIV infection, considerations for the test window period, and signs and symptoms of acute HIV infection. The learner will learn about follow-up monitoring and important educational messages for people on PrEP.

HIV Testing in Retail Pharmacies

This training aims to provide pharmacists and pharmacy staff with the skills necessary to conduct a complete HIV testing session using rapid test technology with control solutions. The training teaches participants CDC's Six-Step HIV Testing Protocol and reviews considerations for implementing HIV testing in pharmacy settings.

HIV PrEP: PrEP and Pregnancy

This course reviews considerations for the provision of PrEP for women during the preconception, antenatal, and postpartum periods in HIV-discordant couples. PrEP is an effective option for women to prevent HIV, while not preventing pregnancy. This course describes how to identify women who could benefit from preconception PrEP, recommendations for prescribing PrEP to women who wish to conceive, safety of PrEP during pregnancy and breastfeeding, and an approach to counseling women about PrEP use.
